Farmers' Market will begin on June 17 at the Town Hall

The inaugural Farmers' Market in Stillwater Township will be open for business on Wednesday, June 17.

An array of vendors will be setting up tables to sell their wares in the parking lot of the Town Hall and will be prepared to return each Wednesday evening until the fall. "We'll go all the way to Halloween if people still have things to sell," says organizer Rick Jacobson. Not all growers may be at the Market each week, if the timing is not right for the items they produce.

Jacobson is hoping to have 10 vendors offering a variety of products. One vendor, Debbie Roth, has worked to recruit others. So far, seven vendors have agreed to participate, and Jacobson and Roth hope more will join in.

These vendors have agreed to participate so far:

- Costa-Roth Gardens. Roth is a local grower who specializes in organic produce and has farms in Stillwater Township and

Grant Township. She has been part of the Stillwater Farmers' Market for years.

- Sunshine Barkery. Beverly Friendt, of Pine Springs, makes homemade dog biscuits and other items for pets.
- Mike's Popcorn. This Centuria, Wis., business makes caramel corn and cheese corn, and offers pint jars of homemade popping corn.
- Don's Specialty Greens. Lake Elmo resident Don Slinger offers organic greens.
- Vegetables by Kao Xiong. This Stillwater Township resident grows and sells vegetables such as peas, carrots and potatoes.
- Honey Pine Apiary. Stillwater resident Jerry Linzer offers various honey products.

- Deanna Buzicky, of Stillwater, will sell Natural Insect solutions and other garden products.

The Farmers' Market will be open from 3 to 8 p.m. each Wednesday evening. For more information, or to sell locally grown items in the market,

Dog licenses are necessary

The current period for dog licensing started on July 1, 2008, and the licenses are good through June 30, 2010. All dogs that will be in the township for more than 30 days a year need to be licensed. Contact Kathy Nelson at (651) 439-0796 for more information.

Sign up for emailed newsletters

The Township newsletter, which is published three times a year, can now be delivered by email. This delivery method saves the Township money and is ecologically preferable to printed newsletters.

Burning restrictions are lifted

Spring burning restrictions have been lifted, but permits are necessary to burn brush. Hours

for burning will be 6 p.m. to 8 a.m. Permits

allow residents to burn piles of brush, leaves, grass or untreated lumber, and can be obtained by calling (651) 439-0796. A 24-hour advance notice for the permit is requested, and the fee is \$15. Failure to get a permit will result in a fine. No fee is charged for burning piles of buckthorn.

Recreation fires do not require a permit and are allowed any time, except for rare occasions when the DNR imposes a total burning ban. Fires must be kept smaller than a 3-foot cube to be considered a recreation fire.

Reservations available for Otto Berg park

The shelter in Otto Berg Park next to the town hall can be reserved for picnics and other gatherings. The cost is \$25 for four hours. Reservations are for the shelter only, and do not include the ball diamond. The diamond can be

reserved during the week, and is typically used then for organized sports, but it is commonly used on a "first come, first served" basis on the weekends.

Beware wild animals

The township is home to a large population of coyotes and even a few bears. They are very active at this time of the year. Use caution around these wild animals, and be watchful of your children and pets. Do not leave food outside. Also be aware that bears are attracted to beehives and bird feeders, especially feeders containing suet.

Restrictions on off-road vehicles

Four-wheelers, dirt bikes, and other off-road vehicles are not allowed on township, county and state road right-of-ways between April 1 and Aug. 1.

They are never allowed on roads or the shoulders of roads. The only exception is vehicles that are being used in farming operations.

When riding on private property be courteous to your neighbors and limit your riding times.

Skeet shooting rules

Skeet shooting is not illegal in the Township, but residents must follow hunting ordinances. Shooting is not allowed except on parcels of land five acres or larger, and there must be written permission from the landowner. Firearms cannot be discharged less than 500 feet from any building. And high-powered rifles cannot be used except into an allowed backstop.

Township will consider single-hauler trash collection

The Township is considering whether to enact a system of single-hauler trash collection, also called organized hauling. If enacted, the township would award to one hauler the right to collect trash from all residents in the Township.

During a recent board meeting, Township supervisors agreed to consider the move, which would require a six-month process of planning and public comment before it could be implemented. The first public hearing will be held on June 11 at 8 p.m. as part of a regular Town Board meeting.

Currently, two haulers operate in the Township: Maroney's Sanitation Inc. and Waste Management Inc. Residents contract individually with the hauler they prefer. Both haulers provide recycling services in addition to trash hauling.

Advocates of organized hauling cite these advantages of the single-hauler system.

- More efficiency and less energy consumption if just one truck—rather than two—makes a pass along each road.
- Cleaner streets if garbage cans are in view just one day a week.
- Potential cost savings by having the township negotiate rates.
- Potential savings on road repair if large trucks are traveling roads just once a week.
- Lower costs to the contractor due to economies of scale.

The primary drawback to organized hauling is that residents do not have a choice of haulers.

Residents are encouraged to attend the public hearing on June 11 to express their views on this topic. There will also be an opportunity for residents to weigh in on the township website at www.stillwatertownship.com.
